

Chiming of the Hour

For many people, the identity of the church has become associated with a rigid morality more focused on individual sins than on the common good. Too often the church is seen as the defender of dominance rather than living as communities of resistance. Tabitha's story in Acts 9 reminds us that everyday individual and congregational acts of love, compassion, and kindness have the power to lift people to life. Tabitha was devoted to the transformation of her community. Peter lifts her up in her service to others. That movement reinforces the idea of a church identity that is dynamic, in motion, and moving beyond its walls. In what ways is our congregational identity one of a congregation moving beyond its walls on behalf of God's justice?





A musician since the cradle, Ray Cox began service as a church music director his senior year in high school and spent most Sunday mornings in front of a congregation until joining Royal Lane Baptist Church in 2016. Along the way, there's been twenty years of service as a music educator, two wonderful boys and a granddaughter, membership in the Turtle Creek Chorale, and six years of marriage with the love of his life, Bryan Tomes. Ray is blessed to be part of such a fine church family.

Patsy Meier

Patsy and Don Meier were part of the Royal Lane family from 1972-77, while Don was a Surgery resident at Parkland. Their three children were born during those years: Lara, '72; Molly, '74; and Ed '76. After Don's 2-year Army service, they returned to RLBC in 1979 and were part of the church until they departed as medical missionaries to Nigeria, West Africa in 1982. They were the last expatriate medical missionaries in the Ogbomoso Baptist Hospital when they decided to return to the USA in 1999. After a brief stay in Dallas, they moved to El Paso for 14 years to provide pediatric surgical care. Returning to Dallas and RLBC in 2017 was truly coming home to family.

Garey Wisdom

Garey has been coming to Royal Lane for over 25 years. He came to Royal Lane in 1989 as the church pianist and became a member in 1993. Over the years he has been church pianist, served on the Deacon Board and the Program Council, and has also served on the tabulating committee. In June 2015 he "retired" from the piano bench and took a seat in the bass/baritone section of the choir. Garey retired from the Federal Reserve Bank of Dallas on August 1, 2016. In 2017 he returned to the Deacon Board for a three-year term. He is enjoying having time to work on home projects and volunteer at RLBC.

The Scripture this morning is Acts 9:36-43, which may be found on page 894 of the New Testament of the pew Bible.

³⁶Now in Joppa there was a disciple whose name was Tabitha, which in Greek is Dorcas. She was devoted to good works and acts of charity. 37At that time she became ill and died. When they had washed her, they laid her in a room upstairs. 38Since Lydda was near Joppa, the disciples, who heard that Peter was there, sent two men to him with the request, "Please come to us without delay." 39So Peter got up and went with them; and when he arrived, they took him to the room upstairs. All the widows stood beside him, weeping and showing tunics and other clothing that Dorcas had made while she was with them. 40Peter put all of them outside, and then he knelt down and prayed. He turned to the body and said, "Tabitha, get up." Then she opened her eyes, and seeing Peter, she sat up. 41He gave her his hand and helped her up. Then calling the saints and widows, he showed her to be alive. 42This became known throughout Joppa, and many believed in the Lord. ⁴³Meanwhile he stayed in Joppa for some time with a certain Simon, a tanner.
