



Wearing Christ and Accompanying Jesus From Weekly Mosaic – January 15, 2020

I own a clerical shirt and collar. I know, it is somewhat confusing to see a Baptist wearing a collar. I went to the office in my clerical garb one day and Harry Wooten humorously wondered if we had changed denominations. Others around the city call me “father.” As a Baptist, we are usually identified by how large our Bibles are and not necessarily by the garments we wear. I don’t wear the collar often as a Baptist minister, but do feel the need to wear something official that identifies me as a clergy person from time to time.

I wore my clerical collar last Monday morning when Faith in Texas leaders and I accompanied a young asylum seeker to her immigration check-in. This young woman escaped her South American home because of war, abuse, and trafficking. Since her story is devastating and horrific, I must keep the details of her name and history confidential. But, needless to say, she escaped for her life. As a representative of Christ, I sought to be a calming and comforting presence as she navigated the unknown and intimidating check-in procedure. Our group of faith leaders stood in a long line in the freezing cold to offer her the warmth and love of Christ. And she knew that God was with her because I was wearing Christ.

Not only was I wearing Christ to bring the presence of God to a young woman in need, but to also to show those working at the immigration office that faith communities and leaders cared about and supported her. It was painfully apparent that this young woman received gentler treatment because we, those of us wearing our clerical clothes, were accompanying her in this process. It was my hope that by being present with her in this intimidating moment, she would know that God and God’s people love her. Although I was wearing Christ that cold January day, I found that Christ was not in my collar. Christ was actually standing next to me in line, for I was accompanying Jesus.


